New Way To Pay!! Online and Phone Utility Payment Option

The online utility payment option that many customers have been asking for is now available at the City of Snohomish.

The City is excited to announce that the online payment option is ready and available through our website, www.ci.snohomish.wa.us Customers now have the choice of paying their utility bills either online or by automated phone **1-877-621-9831**.

The online payment system will accept credit cards (MasterCard, VISA, and Discover) debit cards, and electronic checks (echecks – you will need your bank routing number and account number from either your checking or savings account).

The City of Snohomish has partnered with Paymentus Corporation, a third party automated payment service. You can pay your utility bill any time, any day, 24/7.

Paymentus will charge a service fee of \$6.95 for each transaction up to \$600. Why is there a service fee? Cost of implementing this payment option system is being absorbed by Paymentus with no cost to the City of Snohomish and its other rate payers. Only utility customers that utilize the system will pay for this service.
